



Candidates for Senior Vice President



DONALD S. JONES SR., P.E., CSP, M.B.A., is a regulatory expertise leader for Dow Chemical's Global **EHS Regulatory** Affairs Center. Employed 30 years in the petrochemical industry, he has significant experience in personal and process safety. Jones is a special government

employee of OSHA and a safety and health instructor at Southeastern Louisiana University, where he played a key role in establishing a degree program and an ASSE student section.

Jones earned a B.S. in Civil Engineering from LSU and an M.B.A. from Texas A&M University. He is a registered professional engineer and CSP who was originally certified in the management, construction, systems, engineering and comprehensive specialty areas.

He has held leadership positions with ASSE and other safety and health organizations at local, regional and national levels. Jones has held all Greater Baton Rouge (GBR) Chapter offices, chaired many chapter committees, and served on the Region IV Conference, Government Affairs and Nominating committees. He also served as assistant administrator and administrator of the Management Practice Specialty. Jones is currently Vice President of ASSE's Council on Practices and Standards and a member of the Bylaws Committee and Congress of Councils.

MICHAEL W. THOMPSON,

CSP, is HSE Advisor, Learning and Development, BP America Onshore U.S. Business Unit in Houston. He has 18 years' SH&E and five years' manufacturing and general management experience. Thompson holds a B.S. in Safety Engineering



An ASSE member for 13 years, Thompson is a member of the Engineering, Management and International practice specialties. His past chapter positions, committee and task force appointments include chair, professional development (1995-96); vice president (1997); and president, Gulf Coast Chapter (1998). During his presidency, the chapter received a Chapter Achievement Award. Service to Region III includes deputy regional vice president (1998-99) and region vice president (1999-2003). Thompson has served on the Society's Board of Directors (1999-2003), Council on Member and Region Affairs (1999-2003), Finance Committee (2000-03) and Government Affairs Committee (1999-2003).

In 1998, Thompson was named the Gulf Coast Chapter Safety Professional of the Year. He currently serves as Chair, Information Systems (Finance), is a member of the Business of Safety Symposium Task Force (CoPD), and a member of the Chapter Insurance and Liabilities Task Force (CoMRA).

A critical position on the Society's Board of Directors, the senior vice president serves a one-year term, advancing to successive one-year terms as ASSE president-elect and president, respectively.

The senior vice president is responsible for regional functions, chairs the **Council on Member** and Region Affairs, and oversees chapters and sections outside the U.S. and its territories.

The president-elect oversees and monitors the activities of the council vice presidents for professional affairs, professional development, and practices and standards.

As chief elected officer, the president is primarily concerned with promoting the advancement of the Society and the safety profession, and representing ASSE before members, other relevant professional societies nationally and internationally, and various governmental agencies. This year's candidates for senior vice president are Donald S. Jones Sr., P.E., CSP, M.B.A., and Michael W. Thompson, CSP. Their biographical information appears at left.

The vice president of finance serves as treasurer of the Society and as a member of the Executive Committee. S/he recommends and oversees implementation of the Society's financial policies. This VP is responsible for recommending a budget to the Society's **Board of Directors,** with oversight of adopted budgets and investments, and for recommending accounting controls. This is an elected position with a two-year term. The candidates are Richard F. Moscato, CSP, and Richard C. Nugent, CSP. Their biographical information appears at right.

Candidates for Vice Presiden Finance



RICHARD F. MOSCATO, CSP, is president of The Rimco Group, a safety consulting company. He was senior manager, corporate safety, at Sara Lee Corp.—which has 154,000 employees worldwidewhere he guided the corporation's global safety programs. He managed

the president's international safety training budget, and annually developed and managed the safety department's budget of more than \$500,000 for safety consultants and services for North and Central America, and the Caribbean.

Moscato was corporate safety manager for the Chicago Tribune, International Harvester and Crane Co., and a safety engineer for Liberty Mutual. He graduated from the City College of New York, U.S. Army Engineer School and U.S. Army Command and General Staff College.

Moscato has held ASSE offices at the local, regional and national levels, including past president, Greater Chicago Chapter; Executive Committee, Metropolitan Chapter; and many national committees (e.g., Long-Range Strategic Planning). He is a member of the Management (past administrator), Consultants and International practice specialties. In addition, Moscato is Chair of ASSE's Council on Professional Affairs United Nations Task Force, and Chair of ASSE's 2004 Safety Management Symposium. He received both the Greater Chicago Chapter and Region V Safety Professional of the Year (SPY) awards, and received the Society's distinguished Edgar Monsanto Queeny SPY Award in 2003.

Moscato served on the National Safety Council's Board of Trustees and as general chair (and treasurer for more than 10 years) of its Food and Beverage Section. He received the Council's highest honor, the Distinguished Service to Safety Award. Moscato is also a member of the Safety Executives of New York. **RICHARD C. NUGENT, CSP*,** is general manager, environmental, safety, health and quality assurance for Bechtel-BWXT, which operates the Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory. He has 33 years' experience in the safety, environmental and quality areas. Nugent holds degrees



from J. Sergeant Reynolds Community College, Bluefield College and Virginia State University, and an M.S. in Industrial Technology and Education from the University of Idaho.

An ASSE member since 1982, he has held many offices, including Management Division administrator. Nugent has served on ASSE's Board of Directors as vice president, divisions (1995-96); Vice President, Finance (2002-04); and chair, PDC Planning Committee (1997-99). During his term as PDC Planning Committee chair, the PDC set records for attendance and provided expanded offerings to attendees. He has served on many Society committees and is responsible for leading the task force that developed the first diversity improvement plan for ASSE.

Nugent was named Safety Professional of the Year (SPY) of the Management Division in 1992. In 1998, he received the Society's Edgar Monsanto Queeny SPY Award and the President's Award for his work in diversity. Nugent is a contributing author to the book Essentials of Safety and Health Management and has been a speaker at local, state, regional and national events.

He is active in the community, serving on various boards, including being appointed to the Virginia Governor's Advisory Board and serving as a Boy Scout leader.

an M.S. in Transportation Engineering from Villanova University, where he was inducted into Tau Beta Pi, the National Engineering Honor Society. Throughout his career, he has been involved in multiple aspects of transportation safety.

Daecher currently consults with public and private clients, including municipalities, attorneys, insurance companies, commercial motor carriers, national organizations and other professional groups in all aspects of transportation safety.

He has served as assistant administrator and is currently Administrator of the Transportation Practice Specialty. Daecher is also Vice Chair of the Council on Practices and Standards. He has been a spokesperson on behalf of ASSE for many transportation safety issues and has contributed to the development of ASSE positions concerning transportation and worker safety, as well as ASSE's white paper on driver distraction. Election 2004

Region vice presidential candidates are selected by their respective nominating committees. ASSE's eight regions provide administrative coordination for 150 chapters. International chapters are outside the boundaries of all regions and are represented by the senior vice president. 



ing committee has the option of establishing areas within its region. Areas are groups of chapters within a region organized for the purpose of assisting in chapter administration, mentoring chapter officers and providing guidance and oversight for chapter operations. The new Board of Directors will be sworn in during the annual member meeting on Monday, June 7 in Las Vegas, NV.
