



An ASSE member since 1982, he has held many offices, including Management Division Administrator. He has served on ASSE's Board of Directors as vice president, divisions (1995-96) and Vice President, Finance (2002-05). He also served as chair of the PDC Planning Committee from 1997 to 1999, during which time the PDC set records for attendance and provided expanded offerings to attendees. Nugent has served on many Society committees and is responsible for leading the task force that developed the first diversity improvement plan for ASSE.

Nugent was named Safety Professional of the Year (SPY) by the Management Division in 1992. In 1998, he received ASSE's national SPY Award and was presented the President's Award for his work in diversity. He is a contributing author to the book *Essentials of Safety and Health Management* and has been a speaker at local, state, regional and national events.

Nugent is active in the community, serving on various boards, including being appointed to the Virginia Governor's Advisory Board and serving as a Boy Scout leader.

MICHAEL W. THOMPSON,

CSP, training and development coordinator, BP America Onshore Business Unit, Houston, has 19 years' SH&E and five years' manufacturing and general management experience. He holds a B.S. in Safety Engineering from Texas A&M University.

A critical position on the Society's Board of Directors, the senior vice president serves a one-year term, advancing to successive one-year terms as ASSE president-elect and president, respectively.

The senior vice president is responsible for regional functions, chairs the Council on Member & Region Affairs, and oversees chapters and sections outside the U.S. and its territories.

The president-elect oversees and monitors the activities of the council vice presidents for professional affairs, professional development, and practices and standards.

As chief elected officer, the president is primarily concerned with promoting the advancement of the Society and the safety profession, and representing ASSE before members, other relevant professional societies nationally and internationally, and various governmental agencies. The Society has four councils: Member & Region Affairs, Practices & Standards, Professional Affairs and Professional Development. The Council on Member & Region Affairs is chaired by the senior vice president. The other three councils are chaired by an elected vice president.

These two vice presidents are elected for two-year terms in odd-numbered years. The vice president, practices and standards, serves a twoyear term and is elected in evennumbered years. Biographical information on the four candidates for these council positions begins at right.

The vice president of professional affairs serves as the chair of the Council on **Professional Affairs.** The position is responsible for developing and implementing programs to place the Society in a leadership position in the management of the safety profession, including recognition of the safety professional and enhancement of the profession. The VP also oversees development of professional and educational standards of practice, defines the safety profession and maintains the Society's publication, "Scope and Function of the Safety Professional."


